Busy schedules, labor challenges and personnel constraints have most dairies looking for shortcuts to get the work done on the farm. Sometimes, however, shortcuts come with short results because the task wasn't completed effectively or efficiently. CowManager® offers dairy producers an additional set of resources to help achieve the herd's reproductive and health related goals. This ear tag sensor provides producers the latest in technology to monitor animal fertility, rumination, activity and temperature. Making the system one of the most resourceful "employees" on the farm.

Herd size or facility design doesn't matter when it comes to CowManager. A pasture-based herd of 25 cows or a freestall setup with 20,000 cows can both take advantage of the technology. The information is always available and always updating. The software used is able to interface with nearly all dairy management software. This prevents redundancies in data entry and allows existing systems and sort gates to communicate with CowManager. Automated sort gates assist in bringing only the cows that need attention. This practice will decrease cow handling, consequently increasing labor efficiency and cow productivity.

Together, your management team can integrate these records with the parlor data, dairy management software and sort gates to efficiently identify, treat or breed individuals based on your herd's parameters. The reproductive specialist can go to the sorted cows and not spend time searching in the freestalls and interrupting the non-estrus cows. The nutritionist can look at herd data and notice that the herd has dropped in total rumination time. The herd manager can better focus his efforts on the cows that need attention, versus walking pens trying to get eyes on every cow. The multifunctionality of CowManager technology helps everyone on the dairy make better use of the real-time information. time and labor.

The daily health alerts identify which cows have an elevated temperature, reduced activity or decreased rumination. The CowManager health module frees up time for the highly skilled farm staff. Along with the health and temperature alerts, some simple protocols can be set up to evaluate, diagnose and treat sick cows. CowManager's versatility stretches beyond physical facilities to the many ways it can be used to operate at top efficiency.

"My daily routine has changed; I start with the alerts on my phone and then go to the computer to find more information. The alerts identify a problem two to three days before I see her show clinical signs or we see a drop in production," says Matt Besancon of Cowsmooch Dairy in Wooster, Ohio. The economic impact of helping cows early is real. Getting the cows turned around quickly protects the bottom line from costly treatments and reduced milk production.

Activity alerts in the fertility module help increase conception rates on dairies using CowManager. Graphs indicate exactly when a cow comes into heat, so the timing of insemination can be more precise. Even cows that don't exhibit strong, visual estrous signs can be caught with CowManager. Catching cows in heat allows for high conception and pregnancy rates. Minnesota/Select Sires Service Technician Colten Carlson appreciates the technology in use on the dairies he serves. "CowManager saves me a lot of time and steps. I no longer need to look at each cow in the barn, just the ones in heat. One farm went from two hours on site per day to just 45 minutes after the installation of CowManager," says Colten.

New and long-term subscribers of the CowManager system have access to the latest version of the software. The system routinely updates the user portal and mobile app as part of their standard service. The system is never out of date unless the internet is down. CowManager SERVICE REVIEW

Over the course of my 17 years working for COBA/ Select Sires, I have garnered experience with several herd monitoring systems.

I have sold, installed and provided the training and troubleshooting services to our customers to help them best utilize these programs. As both the salesman and the service specialist, I receive a great deal of feedback concerning the pros and cons of these systems. It is this experience that allows me to share my one-word description of CowManager: versatile.

CowManager is one of the few systems that can serve herds of different sizes, ranging from 10 to more than 50,000 cows. It can meet the needs of both dairy and beef producers, and is well suited for various facilities. I have seen CowManager work well in drive-through freestall barns, facilities with several additions and even pasturebased operations. Producers can easily use this herd monitoring system in congruence with robotic milking or even beef facilities. Herds with multiple sites can function as one system – the only requirement is an internet connection. The coordinator and router can reach up to a quarter mile if there is a clear line of sight. Cows only need to be within 300 feet of the router for their ear tags to be read, and their data continues to stay with them even when they are out of range. The routers are relatively small, about the size of a deck of cards, with easy installation and only require a standard outlet. CowManager is truly versatile.

There is not a one-size-fits-all approach when it comes to the monitoring package. Much like subscribing to a television network provider, a producer can choose whether they want heat detection, health monitoring, and/ or nutrition monitoring. This is especially important for herds only monitoring heifer groups or beef producers only focused on keeping a tight breeding season.

Cow monitoring is here to stay. Producers are becoming more efficient with healthier and higher producing herds. The versatility CowManager offers will fit into operations of all shapes and sizes while helping producers meet their business goals. Having the versatility of hardware, accuracy of detection and most importantly, a knowledgeable team to assist customers in gaining the highest return on their investment is important for long-term success and readily available with CowManager. ◆
